Amsterdam.-Former Crown Prince Wilhelm, of Germany, sent his telegram to the heads of Allied govern. ments offering to surrender in place of Germans demanded in the Allied extradition list almost on the impulse of the moment, according to an interview with Major von Mulenheim, the former crown prince's adjutant, published in the Telegraaf.

"The former heir to the German throne," said the major, after confirming reports that a telegram had been sent, "tood his resolution without thinking long about it. The return of Baron Lersner from Paris, and the serious situation which has arisen in Berlin in consequence, prompted the prince to send his telegram. He hopes by this to avert serious difficulties for Germany,


