HAVE NEW CLUB ROOMS.

The Club Rooms of the Ladies' Branch of the N.I.W.A. were formally opened last night. The President, Mrs. Earle, called on Mr. Frank Walsh to read the formal declaration of the opening of the rooms. Mrs. Earle then addressed the assembly. She had asked Mr. Walsh to perform the formal act of opening the rooms, because he had been associated with her in one of her earliest and greatest struggles to obtain recognition of the rights of the girls. He had stood by her and the girls, openly and fearlessly and at the risk of losing his job at the Knitting Mills. The rooms were tastefully decorated, and the Lady President called attention to the motto of the Association, "Each for All and All for Each," and of the particular motto of the Ladies' Branch, "Love One Another," which, with other mottoes and pictures, decorated the walls. Love, she said, was her motto. She loved the girls and felt sure that they loved her.

A motion made by Miss J. Kennedy, Treasurer, and seconded by Miss M. Malone, Secretary, thanking Mr. Walsh for his kindness in formally opening the rooms, was carried by acclamation.

Mr. T. M. White, Past President of the parent Association, gave a short address, in which he called upon his hearers to be loyal to the Association, loyal to each other and loyal to their contracts with their employers.

Mr. Warwick Smith was glad in this age of regulations that no one had attempted to regulate all our innocent pleasures.
