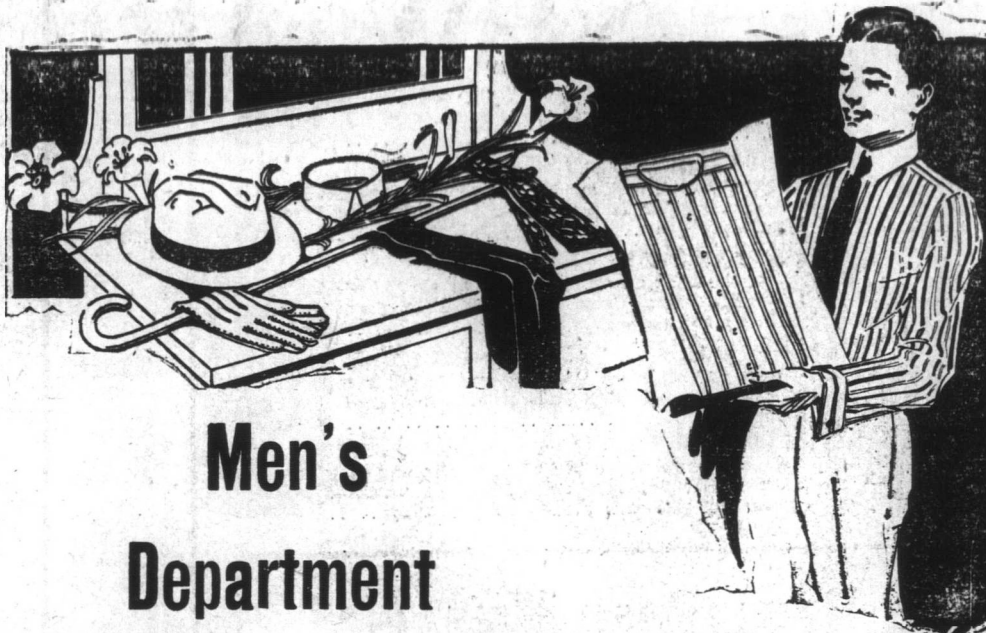

To-Day's Messages.

THE PRINCE AT MELBOURNE.

MELBOURNE, May 26.

The Prince of Wales was warmly acclaimed on his arrival here to-day. The fleet met the Renown, while airplanes circled over the harbor. Three thousand pigeons were released as in the midst of cheering crowds, the Prince debarked and drove through thronged streets. Railway and tramway strikes, which had been threatened would be called during the visit of the Prince, were averted through compromise.

COMPROMISE COMMISSION.

WASHINGTON, May 26.

Suggesting embargoes by the U. S. on products required by Canada for her industries, to meet Canadian embargoes on pulp wood the House Foreign Affairs Committee to-day favorably reported a Senate resolution for special commission to deal with the Dominion Government on the subject.

MILITARY PRECAUTIONS.

LONDON, May 26.

More troops are being despatched to Ireland to combat property destruction and similar movements, which are continuing there. Unexpected orders were received to-day at Aldershot for the Cameron Highlanders to leave tomorrow for service in Ireland. The evening newspapers all give this development special prominence, it being added that not only is the garrison in Ireland being increased, but that steps are being taken to replace younger soldiers by better disciplined troops, in order to prevent reprisals such as have occurred in the past.

INCENDIARY FIRES.

DUBLIN, May 26.

Destruction of property in Ireland by fire is continuing. Tuesday evening, Kilbride Castle, near Brandon County, Cork, one of Ireland's ancient landmarks was destroyed. It is estimated that the damage was a hundred thousand pounds. The Castle was unoccupied.

DEMOCRATS AGAINST IT.

WASHINGTON, D.C., May 26.

Opposition within the ranks of the President's own party developed to-day to Mr. Wilson's request to Congress for authority to accept a mandate over Armenia. Senator Hitchcock of Nebraska, Administration Leader in the Peace Treaty fight, joined the Republicans in opposing the proposal and it was indicated that other Democrats would stand by him.

NO CONFIRMATION.

LONDON, May 26.

British official quarters have no confirmation of a reported second landing by Bolsheviks in Persia, or an advance inland compelling the British to move from Reest to Ward Teheran. Since May twenty two no news has been received from British sources in Persia of any development in the situation.

TWO FIRES AT MONCTON.

MONCTON, N.B., May 26.

Loss to the extent of between thirty and forty thousand dollars was caused by a fire which broke out to-day in the Bank of Nova Scotia building, corner of Main and East Market Streets. The blaze originated in the Orange Hall on the third story of building, and had gained considerable headway before being discovered. The fire department had barely returned from the Record Foundry Company, where a property loss of about forty thousand dollars occurred and firemen continued on duty for another two hours before the second big fire of the day was drowned out.

TREATY RATIFIED.

PARIS, May 26.

The Chambers of Deputies this afternoon, ratified the treaty of St. Germain with Austria.

HIS HOLINESS AND IRELAND.

ROME, May 26.

"In this hour Ireland needs special help from above, so that what she legitimately longs for may be obtained without falling short in any way of her duties." Pope Benedict made this statement to more than three hundred Irish ecclesiastics and laymen, whom he received at the Vatican to-day.

CHANGE AND COUNTERCHANGE.

PARIS, May 26.

A rupture of diplomatic relations between Czechoslovakia and Poland is feared in official circles here, as the result of a crisis over the situation in the Teschen Plebiscite area. Information received here indicates that re-arrangements between the two countries regarding the situation of their nationals in Plebiscite regions, have reached an acute stage. The Poles are accusing the Czechs and the Czechs are accusing the Poles of responsibility for repeated riots and a multitude of crimes as well as of discrimination against their respective nationals.
