London, Aug. 6th.—Several failures in the Liverpool cotton trade are announc-ed to-day. New York, Aug. 17.—The Herald's

The present lessee of the premises is an American, who took it for the purposes of speculation. An admission fee of fifty cents is charged all-comers, and people who do not wish to pay this sum are perwho do not wish to pay this sum are permitted to remain outside of the gates. The fence is on the regular road allowance, within a few feet of the river, and this Yankse has no right whatever to put it there.
