

"In New York State, the old guard of the Republican party was intensely bitter towards Roosevelt, and voted the Democratic ticket in large numbers. They did not relish the beating he gave them at the convention, and rather than see him win, they bolted the ticket. The race-track men and Wall street interests were against Stimson, and both are powerful factors. The vote shows that in the Governor districts, where Hughes received the bulk of his support against the race-tracks, the polling was strongly Democratic."

The re-election of Governor Harmon, the Democrat, made him the most-talked-of candidate for the presidency on the Democratic side, and several of the travellers declared that Ohio would add another son to the list of presidents.
