

Resolution of Sympathy Was Passed at Meeting Tuesday Afternoon.

Reid and Mr. William Moore verbally reported on the improvements made and several of the other directors, in expressing their approval, declared that the grounds were in unusually excellent condition this ear. Mr. Moore recommended that after this year's fair, all the buildings, and particularly the grandstand, noroughly cleaned.

It was decided to add a hackney class r ponies to the prize list. Two sections were made, one for stallions and one for mares.


