at Work.

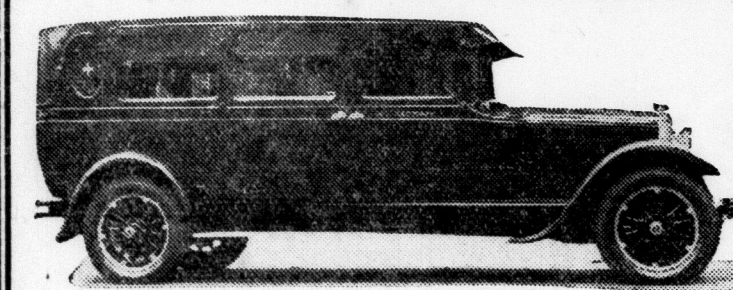

WORK IS STARTED ON LINE TO ROUYN

Company Builds Line For C. N.
R. On Money Advanced by
Prominent Bankers.

Montreal, Oct. 22.—More than one
statement was issued by Sir Henry
Thornton, chairman and president of
the Canadian National Railways,
from the headquarters of the system
here today:

"There has been more or less dis-
cussion in the press with respect to
the construction of a railway from
Orbigny, on the National Transcon-
tinental, to Rouyn, Quebec, which
important interests propose to make,
for the purpose of serving a large
mining development. More than one
competitive project for the construc-
tion of a railway into the Rouyn dis-
trict seemed to be under promotion,
and prompt action was, therefore, es-
sential if the National railway sys-
tem was not to find itself eliminated
from the field. For these reasons it
was decided that a line should be
built by a separate company and
financed without calling upon the re-
sources of the Canadian National.

Work Commenced.
Work on the line has commenced.
The contract having been let to the
lowest bidder. The estimated cost of
the line is somewhat less than three
million dollars, and the following ar-
rangements have been made with re-
spect to finance: As the work pro-
ceeds the funds necessary for the
payment of the contractors will be
advanced by well-known bankers. In-
terest will be paid at the rate of four
and a half per cent per annum, but
will be paid only as the work is
done. The line will be owned by the
company. Upon completion of the
work and the determination of the
exact cost, bonds will be issued
and sold for that amount. When the
line is completed, the company will
be authorized to lease the property
from the constructing company for a
period of thirty years at a rental
based upon four and a half per cent
interest and sinking fund require-
ments. The crown has the right
under the lease at any time to acquire
title to the whole of the property
upon assuming the outstanding bonds.
Upon the expiration of the lease the
crown acquires title to the whole of
the property without encumbrance,
the rental having discharged all obli-
gations.

No Commissions Paid.
"It may be definitely stated that
no commissions, fees or emoluments
of any sort have been or will be paid
to anyone.
"The province of Quebec has sub-
sidized the undertaking to the extent
of \$50,000 per annum for five years,
and the Noranda Mines Company has
also agreed to contribute \$20,000 a
year for five years against any de-
fects which may appear."

Rose (Methodists).

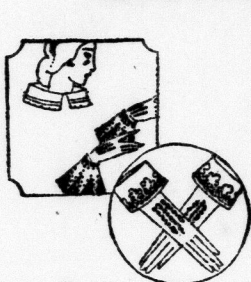
PARKHILL RIFLE TEAM LEAVE FOR LONDON MEET

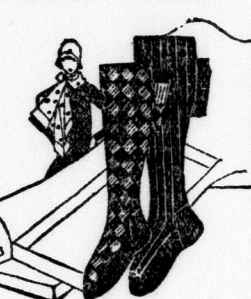

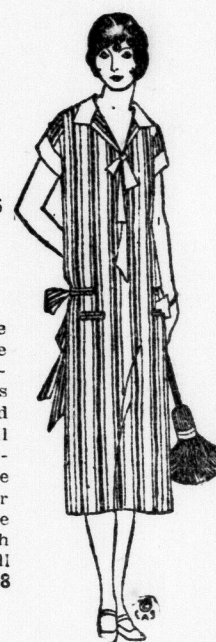
