SUPREME COURT .-- COMPROMISE IN THE STAMP SUIT .- At the opening of the Supreme Court yesterday morning the Chief Justice said that from the evidence adduced in the suit of Stamp vs the B C & V I Sawmill Co, it appeared to the Court that the case was one which should be compromised. He threw out the suggestion with a view to putting an end to the present proceedings. The Counsel on both sides, acting on his lordship's suggestion, retired to confer, and after about an hour's absence, Counsel for the defendants stated that they had consented to a verdict for \$14,000, which was accordingly entered and the jury discharged. The Chief Justice congratulated both sides upon the satisfactory termination of the suit. The verdict carries costs.

CANADIAN CHEESE.-The establishment of cheese factories in Canada may be said to date from 1863. Up to the close of 1865 there

were only ten in operation in Upper and two in Lower Canada At the close of 1866 there were 60 in Upper, and 12 in Lower Canada, using in the aggregate the milk of 21,600 cows, producing about 6,480,000 lbs. of cheese. Before the close of 1867 there were in Ontario 180 factories, with an annual productive capacity of 12,000,000 lbs. (at 10c. \$1,200,000) and in the prov-

ince of Quebec 17 factories with a capacity equal to 1,530,000 lbs valued at \$153,000.
