Captain Murdoch Landry of Dalhousie has been appointed to command the S. S. Canada, and Mr. P. Bolduc, a former chief engineer takes charge of the engine room. Captain Landry is well known around here and his appointment is a most popular one. Under his hands the traditions of the Canada for safety, punctuality and reliability will be well maintained. Since the discharge of the late Captain and chief engineer many rumors have been in circulation regarding the safety and stability of the steamer which as in the case of all rumors are very difficult to trace to their origin. For the benefit of those interested we might say that the Canada has been making her regular trips calling at all ports and has met with no mishaps as far as the press is aware. The vessel was inspected at Quebec before going on her regular run and nothing has happened to her since arriving here which could invalidate her certificate. Some minor repairs were recommended by the inspector at Quebec which have since been carried out. From what we can learn there is no reason to believe that the vessel is all she is claimed to be and thoroughly seaworthy and the matter appears to be but the empty talk of two disgruntled employees who have been discharged. The steamer is making her trips regularly on time and passengers are receiving the same courteous consideration which they have always received on board S. S. Canada.

ties and the natural resources of our town and district. Every year since 1910 the exports from this section have been increasing, mostly in shipments to the United States and from recent information received this present year will exceed all others by a large margin.

Notwithstanding the increased space in the railway yards (Campbellton being a divisional point on the I. C. R.) time and time again have the large freight yards been so congested with traffic, that it was found almost impossible to get cars moved and an extra shunting engine had to be requisitioned.

In this issue we are publishing a few cuts of several of the better known

buildings, which would do credit to many a larger town than this. The Post Office and Custom House, the banks, the new station, St. Louis and Waverly hotels, Grammar School, Baptist and English churches and many other buildings are built of brick and stone.

The Town Council has purchased land for widening streets, new sewers are being put down and new sidewalks are being constructed in several districts. In the past year a fire alarm system was installed, which with our own municipal Electric lighting plant puts Campbellton in her proper place, that being one of the most progressive towns on the North Shore. Long may she thrive and flourish.

The Campbellton Baseball team will go down on excursion train and play a return match with the strong Chatham team that appears here on July 1st.


