### Nitrogen From the Air

It is now a well-established fact that nitrogen forms the principal element in plant food. Other things being equal, the growth of vegetation is determined by the amount of nitrogen in the soil in a form available for plant food. The problem of returning to the soil the nitrogen used up in crop growth is one of the most important in agricultural

Experiments conducted for seven years at the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, show that rain and snow help to restore some, at least, of this nitrogen to the soil. The average annual precipation in the vicinity is about 34 inches and the average quantity of nitrogen per acre returned to the soil by rain and snow is about 6 pounds, of which available form, and as for the most part it is supplied at a season when vegetation is active, the action of rain in supplying plants with nitrogen is not without importance. The nitrogen brought down by

rain is, of course, derived from the air, where it is found both in gaseous compounds, such as ammonia, and genous matter. The chief source from which these substances are derived is combustion. 
