NOTE AND COMMENT

Prof. Albert Bushnell Hart, of Harvard University, predicted in an address before the Navy League at Washington, Monday, that within five years Mexico will be a dependency of the United States.

Officers' casualty lists for the month of February show that the British army lost 263 killed, 597 wounded and 25 missing, a total of 875. This brings the aggregate loss since the beginning of the war to 23,962, of whom 7420 have been killed or have died of wounds, 14,755 wounded and 1,787 missing or prisoners of war.

Over 25,000 hogs have to be brought weekly into Canada from the United States to meet the demand. Ontario farmers should increase their herds of hogs sufficiently at least to supply our own market. There is every indication the price of hogs will remain high for some time. Hogs and sheep are the most prolific of all live stock and the quickest to stock up with.

Senator Cloran gave notice in the Senate of a resolution asking leave of the Imperial Parliament to amend the British North America Act so as to provide that when the Senate rejects at two consecutive sessions of Parliament legislation having its origin in the House of Commons, the House of Commons at the ensuing session will have power to adopt or pass such a measure without further reference to the Senate. Senator Cloran's resolution was received with applause.

The discovery of a new non-alcoholic beer has been made in England the sale of which, it is announced, will be pushed as far as possible in the English public houses. "It smells like beer; it looks like beer; it tastes like beer—the only difference is in the headache," says the statement issued by the Liquor Control Board. In a test case a workman drank twenty pint bottles without becoming intoxicated. The new drink will be placed at the disposal of Parliament, in the House of Commons bar. Thus, for every problem a solution is found and thirst need not go unquenched when prohibition comes into force in Ontario. British Women to Work on Farms

A month has now passed since the English Board of Agriculture appointed ten women organizers to the work of seeing that every county down to its smallest village was organized. Already the work is well on towards completion. Village registers were opened and both women and farmers were made acquainted with them. The fact that farm labor can be "diluted" by unskilled women is being realized—there are openings for both trained and untrained women—and the farmers are better pleased when women do not claim to do everything. There are still men to do the plowing, and walking a farrow is not a woman's work.

In many counties the local education authorities are giving instruction in light farmwork and milking, and in some cases farmers are taking in the women as pupils. In Herefordshire, for instance, suitable women and girls are being taken on a farm for a course of six to eight weeks as milkers. A sum of money is allotted to them in the form of an exhibition or scholarship, and this covers the cost of instruction and provides 10s a week each for maintenance. The cowman gets 5s a week for the first pupil and 1s a week for every extra one. Similar arrangements are being made locally for training in the care of calves, pigs and poultry.

All over the country women are registering for farmwork. Already 15,000 women are at work under the new scheme, and the registered women are forming a big reserve army. The Government armet, a red crown on a dark green ground, has been authorized. The Government badge will only be given after a definite period of proved service on the land, and is likely to be much prized.
