School Board Fight

May Explain Fire

(London Free Press) Fire Marshall Heaton Probes Conflagrations at Bracebridge High School.

Bracebridge, Ont., July 22.—Sensational stories following two serious fires at the high school were hinted at during the official inquiry held here to-day by Fire Marshall Heaton.

Following up rumors of lack of discipline among the pupils, differences between the principal and the school board, and the futile efforts to arrive at satisfactory explanations, the provincial fire marshal was unable to arrive at any definite conclusions. The investigation will be continued in Toronto on Friday, when officials of the insurance companies concerned will be faced with to-day's evidence, and when public school Principal Minnes will be asked to give testimony.

Although over 30 witnesses were heard here to-day, and while the majority of the evidence indicated that the fires were of incendiary origin, nothing of value in determining the actual cause of the \$13,000 conflagrations was brought to light.
