THE PRIZES AWARDED.

The final awards in the literary competition offered by the Dr. Williams' Medicine Co., of Brockville, Ont., have just been announced. The decision as to the order merit of the five stories selected was left to a vote of the readers, and that great interest was taken in the matter is shown by the fact that 16,728 votes were recorded. "A Night on Crookback," by Dua (Mrs. R. S. Smellie, Toronto,) received 4,655 votes, the largest number cast and is awarded first prize. "The Lady of Beauce," by Othmas (Thos. Swift, Ottawa,) comes second with 1,403 votes. "The Fall of York," by Allan Douglas Brodie (T. Herbert Chestnut, Toronto,) takes the third with 3,004 votes. "The House of Eulalie," by Margery Tooker (Mrs. C. F. Fraser, Halifax, N.S.,) has the fourth place with 2,500 votes. "The New Eden," by Iagoo, (C. B. Keenleyside, Brantford,) 2,166 votes, is awarded 5th prize. The prizes are \$100, \$75, \$60, \$40 and \$25. The Dr. Williams' Medicine Co. deserves much credit for so liberally assisting in developing a Canadian literary talent.
