France through its foreign minister has agreed that prior to the meeting of the fifteen there should be a meeting of the fourteen countries. For the past two months now the representatives of the fourteen in the NATO Council, pursuant to instructions from governments, have been considering the pratical consequences of the French decision, and we have set up through them a number of working groups who will be reporting to the fourteen, and through the fourteen to the fifteen on Tuesday, on matters that flow from the French decision. Now, there will be some matters that will have to be resolved at the meeting on Monday and discussed with the Government of France on Tuesday. The French Government has said that the NATO Military Headquarters will have to move, and since that decision is final, we will have to consider comong; ourselves where the military headquarters known as SHAPE will be located. This decision will take place, in all probability, next week. There will likewise have to be a decision as to where the Defense College is to be located, and we will give consideration as to whether or not the military committee will move from Washington to another We will also have to give consideration to locale.

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As to the location of the Council itself, which is the political deliberative organ, that in the judgment of Canada at the present time is not a matter that has to be decided forthwith. I am not saying that there will not be a decision about this

what happens to the standing military group.

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
