The new journal is edited by Mr. Murray Goldblatt, formerly Ottawa Bureau Chief of the Toronto "Globe and Mail", and Mr. Pierre Ducharme, an officer of the Department, with the advice of an editorial committee under the chairmanship of Mr. L. A. D. Stephens, Director-General of the Bureau of Public Affairs of the Department.

The first issue, of 40 pages, contains articles on China's entry into the United Nations and on China's foreign policy (by Dr. William G. Saywell, Chairman of the Department of East Asian Studies of the Univeristy of Toronto); the recent International Monetary Agreement; nuclear testing; Canadian-Soviet relations; the Francophone Agency for Cultural and Technical Co-operation (by Dr. Louis Sabourin, Director of the International Co-operation Institute of the University of Ottawa); the refugee problem in Mest Bengal; and the Stockholm Conference on the Environment. Copies of the new journal are being sent to all former subscribers to the Monthly Bulletin, and will be on sale in Information Canada book shops.
