The janitor of an apartment house which has the telephone No. Passy 4445, answering the ring of the bell, was startled and horrified on taking up the receiver to hear a woman's voice

"Central" Couldn't Help.

The frightened janitor dropped the receiver, bolted for the street and called a gendarme. The officer returned with the janitor to the telephone and himself heard over the receiver the shrieks of terror. As he listened they became broken and faint and there was the sound of a fall, but no sound of the click of the receiver being replaced. Meanwhile the operator on the exchange had also heard the frantic cries and she came in on the frantic cries and she came in on the wire to tell the gendarme that she was unable to trace the telephone from which the call with its tragic screams

had come.
