## HORSES COMING IN FROM MARYLAND

Mike Daly Has Fifteen, Including Four Jumpers—Woodbine Training Notes.

Horsemen who raced their horses over the Maryland tracks this spring and who intend racing at the coming Woodbine meeting are beginning to arrive in large numbers. Yesterday afternoon four different stables arrived from the Pimlico track and several other large stables are expected in today.

Mike Daly brought fifteen, four of which are jumpers. Carter, Chester Krum, Grey Planet and Bobby Boyer are the others in the Daly string. Sand Bar, winner of last year's Hamiton Derby, Between Us, now owned by A. L. Pratt of Toronto, Kingly, Reliance, Royalty, Superintend, Sleuth, Black Flank, Fred, Jen and the two-year-old Milestone. Harvey Boyle will do the riding for the stable thru the field and Jockey Ed Ambrose on the flat.

The eight horses belonging to Gwyn Tompkins arrived in charge of Johnny Kermath who is now training the Tompkins horses at Woodbine. For the Tompkins stable for several years and was regarded as one of the best cross-country riders in America, but owing to bad health had to give up the saddle. Mr. Tompkins accompanied the stable from Pimlico.

There are six timber tippers in the string. They are: Welsch, Juvenence, King Cash, March Court, Moonstone, and Ruffo. The other two are Hermann, a 4-year-old, and 2-year-old, Bird Land.
