come from God. Nothing more; not exclusively THE Teacher, but simply one of the many teachers come from God to enlighten and to bless the world. What Nicodemus had to learn -what thousands of professing Christians need to know; what indeed the whole world shall yet be made to see—is, that Christ is more than a teacher come from God; He is THE RESURREC-TION AND THE LIFE. Eternal life dwells IN HIM, "for as the Father hath life in Himself so hath He given to the Son to have life in Himself." Therefore, until we know Christ as our LIFE, we know Him not. "He that hath the Son hath LIFE, and He that hath not the Son of God hath NOT life." To this bear all the prophets witness; to this our Lord Himself and His Apostles unite their testimony, "That God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in His Son."
