fuffered those under our controul to commit them with impunity: Or if, after making extensive conquests, we have robbed innocent and defenceless nations of the benefit and protection of their ancient governments, without establishing new ones in their stead : Thus leaving them an easy and a tempting prey to avarice and cruelty. The bloody and

prey to avarice and cruelty. The bloody and deceitful man, the vengeance of God will furely overtake.

But, in the midft of all our fubjects of confeffion and forrow and lamentation, whether of a private or public nature, and with a firm refolution to contribute all in our power to correct what is amifs, and to do our utmost for the national welfare, by carefully keeping every man of us *from his iniquity*, now that the Hoft has gone forth against the enemy, we fhall do well alfo to turn our thoughts on the peculiar and feafonable bleffings which the Almighty has poured down upon us, left, if we fhould fail to mark them, or prove ungrateful for them, he may turn a deaf ear to our fupplications for farther mercies.

Among
