**HAMILTON, June 24.—(Special.)**—The aldermen to-night passed three new bylaws which call upon the Street Railway Company to double the number of cars that it now operates during the busy hours of the day, to provide new cars and to improve its roadbed.

An immediate application will be made for a street car company to carry out the provisions of the new bylaws. The building of the east end station, the annex sewer and the isolation hospital will be left over until next year. An amended order for \$17,000 four per cent. bonds at \$1.45 was accepted. The bylaw compelling the abatement of smoke nuisance was backed. Residents of the east end of the mountain will be given a water supply if satisfactory arrangements can be made.
