TWO BURIED IN TRENCH.

Italian Laborers Have Narrow Escape in High Pressure Cut.

A cave-in in the trench for high water pressure mains in Bay-street came close to costing two Italians working in the cut their lives.

The men were buried in the sand for nearly five minutes, and it was only heroic work at the shovels by their fellow-workers that saved them from death by suffocation.

Nicholi Sylvester and Franca Anarelli, 222 Chestnut-street, were inserting braces in the trench at 9:45 yesterday morning at a point where the trench is ten feet deep.

The men were buried in the sand and before the men could scramble out they were buried beneath a mass of sand and clay.

The remaining workmen piled their shovels desperately, yet with great care lest they should strike the buried men.

At last Sylvester was taken out and then his companion was drawn from the trench.

Both men were removed to St. Michael's Hospital, where Anarelli was found to have sustained a fracture of the collar bone.

SAYS STRIKE IS OVER.

Employers' Secretary Maintains Machine Shops Are Fully Manned.

J. G. Merrick, secretary of the Employers' Association, says the machine strike is over so far as the employers are concerned, as they have a full complement of mechanics in the shops and are turning out all orders satisfactorily.

Mr. Givens, business agent of the machinists, says there is the only order for a nine-hour working day, the rate of wages to be the same as is now paid for 10 hours.

The men consider their request most reasonable and are standing firm. The men holding out are those refusing to recognize the union, but having the majority of employers with them the men say the others must come in line.
