Postmaster Bogart, Baseball Man and Editor, Arrested for Tampering With Mail. Wilkes-Barre, Pa., March 9.—Edward F. Bogart, postmaster of Wilkes-Barre, was arrested to-day, charged with tampering with the United States mails. About two months ago several complaints were lodged with the postal authorities at Washington that mail was disappearing, or that which they received bore evidence of having been opened by a steaming process. Detectives found the postmaster seated at his desk, on which lay three letters addressed to prominent business men of this city, and all of them opened.

A NEW MAN-KILLER. Cleveland Man Has Invented a Gun Which Will Kill Fast.

Washington, March 9.—There was a private test at the navy yard to-day of a new magazine rifle, the invention of S. N. McLean of Cleveland, Ohio. General Miles and some army officers witnessed the test. The new gun uses the gases generated by its first shot to operate the magazine mechanism. It can be so arranged that one pull of the trigger empties the magazine, or it can be fired at intervals as desired, the automatic arrangement ejecting the empty shells, reloading and cocking the piece. The test on the whole was satisfactory.
