

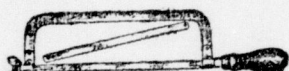

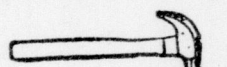

PATRICIA, Bryant Washburn in "The Man Who Was Afraid"

"The Man Who Was Afraid," an Es-sen-say production, starring Bryant Washburn, is the feature screen attraction at the Patricia Theatre today and Saturday. The picture is replete with soul-stirring situations.

Washburn portrays the character of Benton Clune, who, influenced by his mother's frantic pleas, refuses to answer the president's call to arms. The girl he loves spurns him, calling him "slacker." Lacerated by these taunts, Clune hurries his mother from him and joins his regiment in the battlefield.

The enemy in overwhelming numbers threaten them with annihilation. Braving a perilous trip through the enemy lines, Clune gets reinforcements and saves the day. Thus he redeems himself and wins the girl.

Bryant Washburn has done a remarkable piece of acting in this production. He has stepped out of his comedy-drama characterization, for which he is so justly famous, and executed a straight dramatic role which is pleasing in its newness and notable for its realism. It is not so often that we find an actor on the screen who can render two such widely varying impersonations with the same degree of perfection.

There is a mitigating circumstance for a man's failure to answer his country's call. It is his mother. The mother, whose whole life is wrapped up in her son, cannot be blamed for clinging to him, nor can she be charged with dishonour who pauses momentarily at her pleas. Mr. Washburn's interpretation of this thought, upon which the story is based, is one of the big appeals in this picture. It strikes directly to the heart and sticks there.

Yet patriotism wins out, as it should. The all-consuming love of country finally predominates. The mother yields her claim to the nation, and the son, branded "slacker" and spurned by the girl he loves, because of his hesitancy, rushes to join his regiment on the battle line.

And here the picture deals still more tenderly with the mother's noble sacrifice. The regiment is suddenly threatened with annihilation by an overwhelming enemy. Colonel calls for a volunteer to face almost certain death in a perilous journey for reinforcement.

Those who heard the son, a "slacker" hold back. He steps forth and accepts the hazard. He saves the day after a trip through the enemy's lines, which is replete with hairbreadth escapes, and thus wins redemption and the girl he loves.

A Fox comedy, "A Footlight Flame," is one continual round of fun. Fox comedies are noted for their originality in introducing screamingly funny situations.

Small and Jordan, high-class sinners, will continue to give the excellent entertainment of their splendid singing. They are the best vocal team that has appeared here in months, and their rendition of the most difficult selections from the masters is a treat that no music-lover should miss.

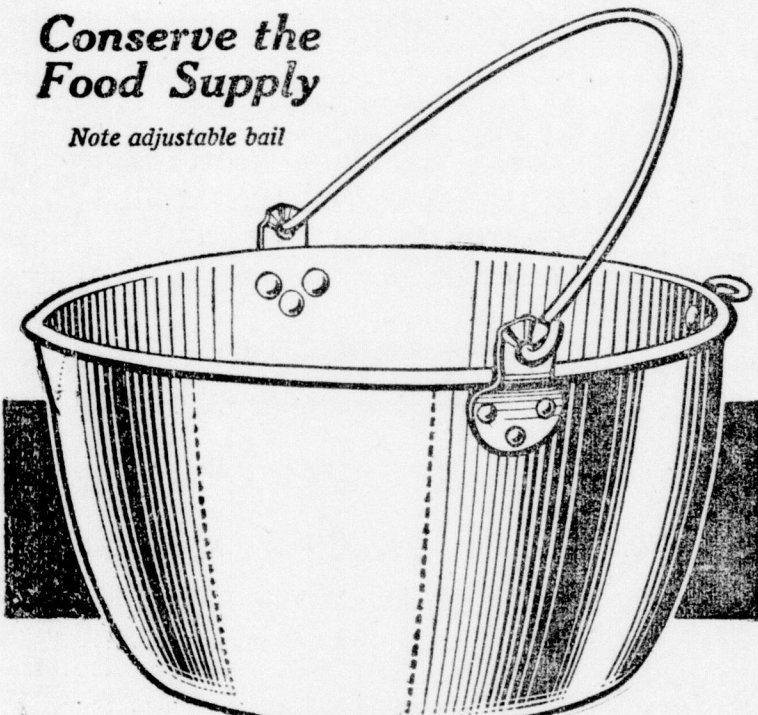

REPAIRED MARKET HOUSE WILL BE RE-OPENED FOR BUSINESS ON SATURDAY

The newly-repaired market house will be used by vegetable purveyors for the first time since its renovation tomorrow.

The walls of what was previously the market poultry shed have been knocked in and a cement walk built and divided into spaces for the marketers to sell their produce.

Thirty spaces are available on which to sell produce at from \$20 to \$30 each per season, according to the size of the space required.

The initial usage of the new stalls will relieve the congestion which formerly took place every crowded market day, and it is expected that a great improvement in the amount of adequate space will be shown tomorrow.
