LANDERS IS VIGOROUS GETS AFTER EASTWOOD

Also Rubs It Into Newspapers—Parks Board Meeting—Happenings.

HAMILTON, Oct. 15.—(Special.)—The labor meeting this evening was held at the corner of Wilson and Mary-streets.

The parks board had another session this afternoon, considering the application of the street railway for the use of a strip six feet wide at the northwest corner of the Gore Park.

Mrs. Sarah Brown, widow of Fireman Brown, who was burned to death in the T. H. & B. wreck at Imperial Springs, has commenced a suit against the company for unpaid damages.
