THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY of 1878 instructed its Committee on Ecclesiastical Procedure to complete the work in preparation, and publish it as a useful guide to the Office-bearers of the Church. The book now issued has been prepared with much care; the books of Procedure, Discipline, Standing Orders, &c., of the leading Presbyterian Churches in Britain and America having been carefully consulted throughout, and the results of the experience of the separate branches of the Church in Canada, in applying the general principles of Presbyterianism having been especially combined and applied to the circumstances of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, the whole being condensed into a book of so small dimensions, will, it is hoped, render it very convenient for use. For convenient reference, instead of sub-divisions under general heads, the whole has been arranged under one series of chapters, and a running number attached to the paragraphs throughout.
