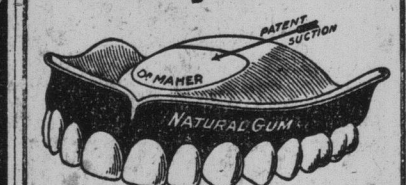
## LARGER PROFITS FOR BANK OF N. S. DURING LAST YEAR

Assets Increased by Nearly \$22,000,000; Increased Liabilities Due Mostly to Larger Note Circulation.

The Bank of Nova Scotia has added to its long history another year of successful operation and the statement of its affairs as at December 31 last, the eighty-sixth, for it was established in 1832—shows good progress to have been made, that its characteristic strength is well maintained and that it continues to afford its full measure of assistance to the business community and public financial operations.

war tax on circulation \$65,000, contributions amounting to \$44,700 were made to the patriotic and Red Cross funds, the customary \$80,000 to the officers' pension fund and \$150,000 was written off bank premises account. There also appears in the list of appropriations the donation of \$100,000 made to the Halifax relief fund, a fund that would naturally make a special appeal to the bank that has been so closely identified with the history of the city now so grievously stricken. The distribution of these sums left a balance of \$800,200 which is being brought forward into the current year.

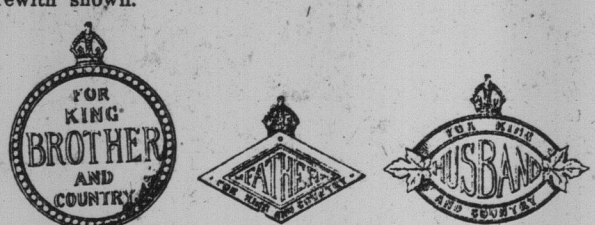
