ACTION BY COMMON COUNCIL ON DRY DOCK AND THE REFINERY
At a special meeting of the common council this morning it was decided to oppose the efforts of the Imperial Dry Dock Company to secure legislation for the purpose of extending the time within which, under act 7, Edward VII, Chapter 80, the construction of the dry dock shall be commenced, notice of which has been given in the usual manner.
The objection to this legislation is that, as it is now proposed to construct the dock outside the city limits, the city is under no obligation to contribute the subsidy which had been promised when it was intended to build the dry dock in Carleton. The bills and by-laws committee was instructed to take the matter up with the provincial legislature.
The council also decided to memorialize the dominion government asking that the grant of land to F. C. Durant for the purpose of erecting a sugar refinery should be annulled so as to open this property as a site for a local industry which wishes to build there.
Mayor Feink presided and there were present: Aldermen McDoldrick, J. B. Jones, Elliott, Green, Scully, Elkin, Colner and Hayes and the Common Clerk.

DISPUTE OVER A BERTH FOR STEAMER
A dispute between the harbor master, Captain Fleming and Captain Walsh, marine superintendent of the C. P. R., was taken up at a meeting of the board. Ald. McDoldrick presiding, at noon today.
The trouble arose over the C. P. R. steamer Montreal which was lying at No. 5 berth and which Captain Walsh wished to place at No. 7. As the Empress was to sail this afternoon and the Allan liner, which is at No. 1, will sail tomorrow, this morning wished the Montreal to remain where she was until this afternoon when she could move over to No. 7. Captain Walsh declined and insisted on using No. 7, to which the harbor master replied that the steamer would be removed and the captain fined.
An appeal was made to the board and the members of the board supported the harbor master in his authority to assign vessels to any berth. To this Captain Walsh did not agree. Some members suggested that the principle involved could be settled by the C. P. R. placing the vessel where they chose and then defending its action in the police court. Captain Walsh arose with the announcement that he would do this but Ald. Jones moved that a committee be appointed with the harbor master with power to act. After some discussion of this proposal the board decided to refer the matter to the Montreal to dock at No. 7, provided that this case was not to be regarded as a precedent. This was agreed to and the meeting adjourned.
