Hon. Mr. Sastri says he regards the British Empire as the greatest humanitarian organization the world has ever seen; that the British spirit is something greater than any single British mind can express; rooted in a desire for justice and truth. In a recent address in Victoria, Mr. Sastri spoke as follows:—

"I have no fears for the future of India. The non-co-operation movement headed by Mahatma Ghandi was doomed to failure because it was founded on utopian and idealistic theories, and it has virtually collapsed already. Whether the arrest of Ghandi had any effect in that regard I am not prepared to say. I would rather not discuss that incident, because I was not in India at the time and I think that its significance has been considerably exaggerated. All I know is that Ghandi is safe behind prison bars and apparently will remain there for six years.

There are certain intelligent people in India who would be glad to support radical ideas, and it was not because of his radicalism that Ghandia failed to win their endorsement. His idea was that he was a saint and that his followers were saints. The people to whom he first went for support did not see any particular value in sainthood and lost interest. "By her achievements in the war India won the right to a status within the empire similar to that enjoyed by the people of the dominions. I don't think that anyone disputes that. At the same time we agreed in 1908 that immigration from India to other parts of the empire would be restricted, and we cannot go back on our word now. To do anything else would naturally create the impression that in international dealings India is untrustworthy. India has made her pledge and she will not evade it.

"That does not alter the fact that there are 200,000,000 people in India who have been prevented from settling in other countries. There is virtually no outlet anywhere in the world for that enormous population, and that is a serious thing. The occupiable places of the empire are reserved for the 80,000,000 whites, while 200,000,000 must remain where they are. All that is beyond my province, and I am not offering any solution, but it is none the less a problem that some day must be settled."

"There is no use in my attempting to convince anyone that anti-British feeling does not prevail in India today. In the first place, such a contention would be false, because there is widespread dissatisfaction, and most of it, I think, is the result of the Mohammedan movement. A very large section of India's population is still bitter about the agreement with Turkey.

Taxation has been increased until it is almost intolerable, and yet the gap between revenue and expenditure is still large. Financially, I should say, India is almost broken. The reason for that is the excessive cost of India's military establishment. The military burden is simply strangling us. At present the supreme authority relating to Indian army matters is centred in the Army Council in London, and, of course, it will take time to alter that system.
