A.403 I seen it there at 8:30. 0.404 8:30? A.404 That's right, Sir. CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER. Private Landry, what gave you the impression that Sergeant Q.405 Lister dozed just before the accident?
