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- Q.395 What about this car that had been following you? What happened to it?
- A.395 Well, they stayed around for a few minutes and they kept going, said he would call up the ambulance, but he didn't.
- Q.396 Did you know who the people were in that car?
- A.396 No, Sir.
- Q.397 Was any effort made to find out who they were by you or anybody in your party?
- A.397 No, Sir.
- Q.398 They gave some assistance?
- A.398 Yes, Sir.
- Q.399 And apparently took word to get the ambulance?
- A.399 That is right, Sir.
- Q.400 How long before the ambulance arrived?
- A.400 It was quite a while, Sir.
- Q.401 How did you return to Camp?
- A.401 Well I walked over from after I got in the Medical Room, Sir.
- Q.402 And what became of the vehicle?
- A.402 Well, they brought it in next morning.
- Q.403 Did you see it in Camp next morning?
- A.403 I seen it there at 8:30.
- Q.404 8:30?
- A.404 That's right, Sir.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER.

- Q.405 Private Landry, what gave you the impression that Sergeant Lister dozed just before the accident?
- A.405 Well, Sir, he worked pretty hard that day and I imagine he was pretty tired.
