

GROUND TO PIECES

Principal Graham Throws Him-self Under Train at St. Mary's.

LEAPED IN FRONT OF ENGINE

Mr. Graham Was Principal of the Simon Street Normal Training School at London—Temporary Insanity Accounts For the Horrible Affairs—Tragedy Killed Aged Woman—Fem-brake Man KILLED.

London, Ont., July 2.—Principal Robert McGraham, of the Simon Street Normal Training School, took his own life in a horrid manner at St. Mary's Junction yesterday afternoon. He was being taken to the Asylum at Guelph for treatment, and died with him, who included his physician, Dr. Teasdall, and Mrs. Graham, his wife, at the Junction to take the east-bound express. As the train reached the platform Graham suddenly stepped before the locomotive and leaped in front of the locomotive, being ground to pieces under the wheels. There were numerous witnesses of the horrible occurrence. The deceased had been suffering from melancholia for some time past, and it became acute upon his being told that he was afflicted with a serious physical malady. He was regarded as one of the brightest minds in the teaching profession in the west, and his conduct was a barister-at-large. He was 47 years of age, and had spent practically the whole of his life here. He was born in Kincardine. He was a member of the Masonic fraternity, and was highly respected by all.

Frances, Mrs. Aged Woman.

Toronto, July 2.—A particularly shocking fatality occurred on Avenue road Thursday night at about 9 o'clock. When Mrs. Elizabeth Ward of 188 Macpherson avenue was killed by a team of horses owned and conducted Ernest Ward. Mrs. Ward was crossing from the west to the south side, and the unfortunate woman fell as she was crossing the tracks, and the car, which was traveling back-ward, the time ran over her, the wheel passing over her head. She died within ten minutes.

Killed Going to Picnic.

Ottawa, July 2.—W. C. Baker, 10 years old, was struck by a Canada Atlantic train yesterday. With his mother and other members of the family he was going to a picnic, and failed to notice a train shunting at South Indian station.
