The national sport is certainly a lusty infant.

And baseball is an infant. Despite the phenomenal development of the past ten years, the game is just getting a start.

Last year \$30,000,000 was paid to see games in organized leagues. While the statement may appear radical, it seems certain that within the next decade this will be multiplied by five. Cities and towns in the United States have a population of 30,000,000. Estimating upon twenty games a season for every fan, it is easy to see the total multiplied not by five, but by ten. The organized baseball situation today is this: Fifty-two leagues, 416 teams, and 6,500 players.
