
Loonie Wednesday Has Been Cancelled Next Week the 11th Due To Remembrance Day and The Hip Concert

# **Grad Class Proje**

Although you may not be thinking in terms of graduation right now, it is important that you take a few minutes to choose a grad class project that's appealing to you.

Your Grad Class Executive has been reevaluating ideas, and options and seeking to pinpoint details on various projects.

It is our responsibility as your executive to keep you well informed of new information that has come to our attention.

on Sunday, Oct. 18/92, (Super Turn-Out!) and the ballots were printed for 3 project choices:

(1) Library Fund

(2) Bricks and Mortar Type Project (3) SUB-Expansion.

Before the voting occurred, another idea of a playground for a daycare was put forth. The outcome, after ballot counting, was a 5 vote spread amongst 3 projects. Most interest was expressed for the playground (with a lead of 5 votes), and then a Bricks and Mortar type project (second place by 5 votes) and coming in third, was

the Library Fund (by 5 votes).

Immediately proceeding the meeting, we began researching the Playground Project idea. The information we learned to date, is that there is NOT an existing daycare. Therefore, for those of you who are still interested in the playground idea, it is feasible to create a Playground Trust fund (described below).

Choosing a Grad Class Project is NOT an easy task, by far! Even before a potential idea for a Project can be placed on a ballot, it must go through a series of feasibility tests. One must ask many questions such as: Is this project feasible? How much will it cost? Will the student's donation of \$25 cover all costs? If the Project is a playground; where will it be built? Or will it be built? If it's a brick type project, where will it be positioned on campus? Once you say words like "cement" or "bricks" or "marble", a high price tag immediately attaches. If the present were to be a Library Fund, what kind of recognition would there be?

How much of your \$25 will be diverted to the purchase of books and how much goes to tangible recognition? Numerous questions...that only begin to scrape the 'Idea of a Project?"

Henceforth, the meeting was an indication that grads are interested in a Playground (if there will be a daycare), a bricks and mortar type project, and a Library Fund. A description of all feasible projects is provided below and we ask that you take a minute to think about your vote.

Playground Trust Fund

Each grads donation of \$25 will be placed in a Trust fund for the construction of a playground, if the daycare is approved. The details on this project cannot be given at the current time since the daycare is not in existence. Although interested individuals can vote for this option and project details are as such: UNB Playground Project

The UNB Daycare Committee has September 1993 set as their target date for an on-campus daycare. We have \$225,000 from the Maritime Higher Education Commission to renovate or build a daycare. The Committee and the University want to build a model daycare - one that is innovate, creative and that will serve as a "model" for future daycare centres in the province and across Canada.

We would also like our Playground to be a "model" - one that is also innovative and creative. We feel that the support of the grad class will enable us to reach this goal. It is an opportunity for the grad class of 1993 to contribute to a project that will be greatly appreciated for generations to

It is also the type of project that graduates can become actively involved in (and I don't mean by playing on it); but by helping design the playground and coming up with creative ways to make it a special tribute to the graduates of 1993. If the playground is accepted as the grad class project, the Daycare Committee would like to set up a special committee to graduates to oversee the development of the

The Committee is proposing that the grad class set up a trust fund for the playground, which, if construction goes to schedule, will be ready for action by the fall of 1993. Presently the daycare committee has a prototype of the playground design from the architectural firm which the uni-

versity hired this year.

To further add to the tangible recognition you will receive, there will be a plaque that will hang in one of the libraries with all donor's names on it. Furthermore, a card/ letter will be sent to you, the graduate, informing you of the book that was purchased with your money, and where it is

**Bricks and Mortar Type Project** 

There has been a considerable amount of interest displayed towards such a project. So, the executive took the initiative to design a project that would encompass the idea of graduates name on something tangible and tying that with something needed to be constructed on campus.

Currently, there are areas on campus in need of new side-walks and/or patios. The need for upgrading and replacing such an area can be done through the Class of '93.

Your donation of \$25 will buy you a 6x6 (inches) square of black granite that will be illustrative of your name, faculty and "Class of 1993". The new walk-way or patio will be constructed with your personalized blocks! An example of what one block would look like is as such:

The lettering will either be cut in lettering or raised lettering in the black granite.

The appealing factor behind such a project allows you to see your name in print for many many years to come. Once you become an alumni you will be asked to give generously back to UNB. Thus this is the only time, as graduates, that you have the opportunity to see your name in print, together as a class!

The walk-way or patio will be constructed and situated in an area on campus that is highly visible, but the exact location will be discussed further, if this option is chosen to be the Class of '93 project.
