To beer or not to beer

The biggest battle of the beer strike is shaping up.

The conflict between the brewery workers' union and Ontario breweries pales to insignificance besides that looming over the interpre-tation of federal and provincial laws.

Can private citizens bring into Ontario from Quebec, where the foam is flowing as usual? Who will stop them at the provincial boundary? Will the police prosecute?

If they bring it in for their own personal use, how much can they get away with?

The Importation of Intoxicating Liquors Act, a Canadian statute, says no person shall transport liquor across any provincial or international boundary except if it is consigned to a board which has the legal right to distribute it.

According to this law, beer could not be brought in from Quebec unless it is ordered by the Liquor Control Board of Ontario. But Staff Ser-geant Currie of RCMP headquarters in Toronto, says the RCMP is not prosecuting under this act because it is antiquated.

The Liquor Control Act, revised statutes of Ontario, 1960 issued in 1966, reads as follows: A person who is entitled to possess or con-sume liquor may lawfully possess liquor that was pur-chased outside Ontario if the liquor was purchased from a liquor board, commission or similar body in any other part of Canada.

However, Det.-Sgt. George Wilson of the Mississauga Police Department says the law does not forbid a person from bringing in beer from

another province. He con-tends if the RCMP and the OPP are not prosecuting under the Importation of Intodeating Liquor Act, there is nothing to prevent an individual from importing suds for his own personal use, provided this person does not intend to sell it.

The Liquor Control Act states no person shall keep for sale, sell, or offer to sell liquor except if legally licenced to do so by the Liquor Control Board.

Liquor or beer may be confiscated from anyone who intends to resell it, if sufficient proof of this intention is given in a court of law.

Meanwhile, beer supplies and the few legal sources in Ontario are quickly drying up. As the battle over interpretation of the law heats up, so do the temperatures and the tempers of Ontario's once-regular elbow-benders.
The end is not yet in sight.
