Camp Borden	1-5-45		<p>0745 hours, ceiling 2000' visibility unlimited. Flying washed in at 0800 hours, washed out at 1800 hours. Total flying time 290.00 hours. Night flying from 2015 to 0300 hours. Total Night flying 60.35 hours.</p> <p>At 1030 hours, Harvard II 2843 flown by F/O F.D. Powell with F/S Chudzik, B. R.200509 under instruction crash landed on Edenvale Relief Aerodrome. The cause was engine failure in the air after opening the throttle on pulling up from a practice forced landing. The crash was category D.5.</p> <p>At 1545 hours, Anson Mk V 11964 with F/O A.R. Griffiths J.37135 as pilot suffered a collapse of the starboard undercarriage while taxiing on the main aerodrome after landing. Crash category C.10.</p>	
	2-5-45		<p>0745 hours, ceiling 10000' visibility 10 miles. Flying washed in at 0800 hours, washed out at 1800 hours. Flying time 237.45 hours. Night flying from 2030 to 0430 hours. Total night flying time 45.00 hours.</p> <p>At 1515 hours, Harvard 3784 forced landed one mile east of Brentwood. The pilot was F/O R.G. McLennan, J.39520 and student was P/O J. Gibbons J.50205 both of whom were uninjured. The crash was category D.2 and was caused by engine failure in the air.</p> <p>At 2345 hours, Harvard II 2660 ground looped on the main aerodrome following a landing while practicing night circuits. The pilot was R.193659 WO.2 C.M. Welsh who was uninjured. The crash category was D.6.</p> <p>Eight Badminton players from the Army camp were guests of this station in a friendly men's doubles tournament with players from this station.
