Uplands, Ontario	1-9-42		Clear, becoming partly cloudy - ground fog. Flying for most of the day.	
	2-9-42		Partly cloudy - ground haze. Flying curtailed somewhat, because of poor flying weather.	
	3-9-42		Cloudy to overcast. Commanding Officer's Weekly Parade was held at 0745 hours on the Parade Square.	
	4-9-42		Partly cloudy to cloudy - ground fog in the morning. Flying for part of the day only.	
	5-9-42		Cloudy to overcast. Light rain in morning. At 1420 hours, 11537, Sergeant Morrison, J.H., a student pilot in Course 63, landed Harvard aircraft 2601 at Edwards Field with the undercarriage retracted. A C-2 category crash. Fairly serious damage to aircraft. Pilot sustained no injuries.	
	6-9-42		Clear. Divine Services were held in the Recreation Hall. At 1305 hours at Main Aerodrome, Harvard aircraft 3236 was running up engine at taxiing post. The right brake was released and swung the aircraft to the left, striking Harvard 2659. 2659 was a "B" category crash, and 3236 a "C-3" category. Serious damage to both aircraft. No injuries sustained by occupants of either aircraft.	
	7-9-42		Clear, becoming cloudy in the afternoon. The Station held a Swim Meet in the local swimming pool, with individual competition, relays and diving exhibitions. At the conclusion of the Swim Meet, a Sports Dinner was held in the Airmen's Mess, when the Commanding Officer presented trophies to the various team winners for the seasonal events. In the evening, an Airman's Dance was held in the Drill Hall, with the R.C.A.F. Orchestra providing the music. A very large crowd was on hand for the dance, and it was enjoyed by all ranks.
