I think your mother was the fourth daughter, was she not?

Did I ever tell you that I got hold of a picture of Mathews from Mrs. O. B. Shepherd. She found it in an old album which belonged to the family of Montgomery, her grandfather, but I have never been able to get a picture of Lount.

If you can **send** me the information I want by return I shall be much obliged as I want to get the pictures framed up.
