3. The oath provided for by this Act shall be administered by such person as the Governor General in Council shall appoint and shall be administered and taken in such form and manner as he shall approve.

10. Besides the form of Oath, the new idea might require consideration of all the rest of the coronation ceremonial. On this South Africa has not yet submitted suggestions, perhaps because it would not need legislation and is therefore not so urgent as the question of the Oath.

11. At present the following points appear to arise for the consideration of the Government:

- (a) Whether to reply to South African agreeing in principle but informing them that Canadian legislation at this Session is impracticable?
 - (b) If so, whether drafting suggestions should be put to South Africa for consideration?
 - (c) Whether to propose a joint study of the whole coronation ceremonial, by means of a Committee representative of the various Governments or otherwise?
