The Department also accepts your offer of \$2,265.

for the furnishing of tables, screens, benches clothes cupand plans
boards, etc., etc., as mentioned in the specifications for
this work.

It is understood that all the above mentioned works are to be completed by the first of September and will be subject to the approval of the Principal of this school and that the general conditions of the specifications of the school building are to form part of the contract.

Your offer for the construction of a bern and poultry house cannot be considered at present, both being much higher than the architect's estimate for these buildings.
