At the time of the visit of the
Timber Inspector of the Department to the Burnt
Church Reserve last spring, the Indians of the band
called attention to serious trespass on the Pokemouche
Reserve by certain white men, who had squatted there
and were engaged in cutting the timber on this Reserve.
The Chief of the band, Paul Taylor was
requested to visit this Reserve and make an investigation
and then report fully to the Department.

He has reported that he visited the
Reserve but up to the present time he has made no
statement as to the matter of trespass, although he
claims that he should be paid his expenses for the trip.

I have therefore to request you on the
next occasion of your visiting the Burnt Church Reserve
to interview the Chief and have him forward a full
report as to conditions on the Pokemouche Reserve and
at the same time forward his account for expenses with
proper accompanying vouchers. proper accompanying vouchers.
