Ottawa, July 5th.1939.

Dear Sirk-

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of June 27th reporting the application of Mr.A.J.MoPherson to lease a portion of the Nesikep Reserve No.6 for the purpose of working placer deposits.

In reply I wish to point out that as the land in question includes an Indian cemetery and Indian improvements, the consent of the Indians by way of release or surrender would be necessary in the first instance. instance.

Of It is noted that Mr.McPherson wishes
to first test out the ground, there appears to be no
objection to this action as such would fall within the
authority already given him to prospect on this reserve.

The Mesikep Placers Ltd.who at one time
held a lease of the same area, apparently still hold
some rights from the Provincial Government by way of
placer leases, and it is not likely that the District Gold
Commissioner would be in a position to grant any placer
rights to Mr.McPherson until the question of the previous
Mesikep Placers Ltd.lease has been finally settled.

In this connection I would refer you to
letter from Commissioner MacKay to you on this subject,
dated April 14th.last. Qi It is noted that Mr. MoPherson wishes
