Circular D. 337. Most Secret. Following for your Prime Minister, Begins:

Balkans.

- 1. Turkish Soviet relations remain obscure, but there are indications that Turkey is apprehensive of Soviet intentions. Germans are generally believed to be exploiting this situation with a view to:
- (1) Getting rid of Turkish Minister for Foreign Affairs;
- (2) Making capital, at our expense, out of settling what may be artificially created Turkish Soviet difficulties.
- 2. According to Turkish Secretary General, Germany has the upper hand of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in Bulgaria and is trying to settle Debrudja question, conversations having begun between Bulgaria and Roumania.
