Q-288 Do you know how many apples have been issued to the Sergeants' Mess?

A-288 Yes, sir.

Q-289 But you are not concerned in the kitchen?

A-289 No, sir.

Q-290 You are only concerned with waiting on table, and tending the bar in the Sergeants' Mess?

A-290 Yes, sir.
