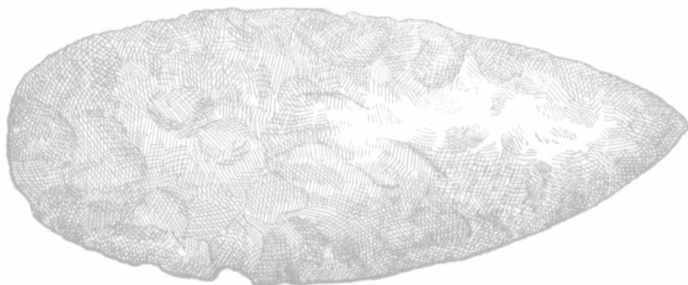
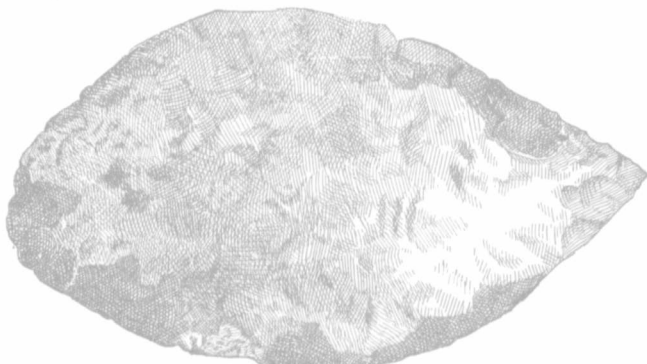
FIG. 82. ($\frac{1}{4}$ Size.)

Figs. 82, 83 and 84 are from the Tidd's Island Mound. They are chiefly remarkable for their great size—so great as to hinder the supposition that they were used even as spears.
