# HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments there to the perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans;-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any perion who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to gradience prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(5) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 89 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with he requirements of the homesteader law is iable to have his entry cancelled, and the land hay be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homostead Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give as months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

#### INFORMATION
