AGREEMENT SAFE

Washington, D. C., Feb. 12.—A complete poll of the senate taken by the New York American yesterday afternoon showed 65 members pledged to reciprocity. The house is already safe for the agreement, as is also the Canadian parliament.

Vienna, Feb. 11.—Baron Albert S. A. Rothschild, head of the Austrian branch of the Rothschild house, died to-day. He was born in 1844. His death was due to heart failure.
