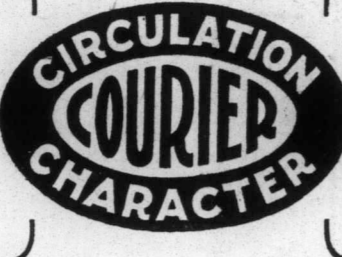

**SEVERELY ILL**  
Galt Casualties  
Lieut. James Aitkin, a popular young Galt, Ontario, who went overseas with Col. Clark's battalion, and was transferred to the Mounted Rifles at the front, was today reported wounded, but remaining on duty.

Mrs. Elizabeth Lottie Bursley, Elgin street, received the sad news that her husband, Pte. Alfred Charles Bursley, 734522, formerly of a Scotch Water-Loe battalion died from intestinal obstruction at a military hospital at Bramshott. He was 37 years of age and a native of Hackney, North Bow, England, and had been by trade. He had not been to the front.

Pte. Albert Wolstenholme, last Wednesday reported seriously ill with nephritis in Canada Hospital, was today reported of the seriousness of his illness.

**Dangerously Wounded**  
Woodstock, April 10.—Pte. Sid Chapman who went overseas with the 4th battalion, has been dangerously wounded, and is confined in a hospital in Letreport, France, suffering from gunshot wounds in the leg and arm. Pte. Chapman went overseas a year ago last October, and has been over a year in the trenches. His two brothers are at the front and his father is in a special service unit in London.

Pte. Ernest Martin who left Woodstock with the 18th battalion was killed in action on October 3 last. This word was received today from his wife, who went to England shortly after her husband left for overseas. Pte. Martin lost a brother a few months before he was killed, and Mrs. Martin's sister died shortly after her arrival in England, leaving six small children, which the war widow adopted. The Oxford patriotic Association insured Pte. Martin for \$1,000 which will go to the widow.

**Severely Wounded**  
Kinairdine, April 10.—Mr. John Hang, of Tiverton, was notified officially on Sunday that his son, Pte. Wm. Hang, had been severely wounded in the shoulder. A brother, Pte. Wesley Hang, was killed in action a few months ago through being run over by a motor truck. Pte. Wm. Hang, enlisted in Western Canada.

The body of Mrs. Wm. Baker, who disappeared from her home, 10 miles north of Brockville last Sunday morning, was found hanging from a limb of a tree half a mile west of her home.
