TVPHOID AT KINGSTON
All Soldiers to be Innoculated—Food is Suspected

Kingston, Aug. 8.—Officers commanding all units here have been instructed to see that the officers, noncoms, and men who have not been innoculated against typhoid must be treated at once, in view of the fact that a number of typhoid cases have developed in the city. The city's water supply has been found all right, and the cause of the fever is attributed to a food supply, possiby lea cream. The Medical Officer of Health has advised people to boil or otherwise cook all food consumed.

New York, Aug. 7.—Three men are dead to-day from injuries, they and nine others suffered in the explosion of a tank of acetylene gas on the British steamship Hutton Wood, taking on cargo at an East River pier vesterday. Four of the injured are not expected to live. The vessel was of steel and of 2,903 tons gross. She was built at Newcastle, in 1905, and was owned by the Constantine and Pickering Steamship Company. 
