Two news Atlantic cables have been ordered under the auspices of Jay Gould. Sir Charles Tupper spoke five hours yesterday, explaining and defending the Pacific Railway contract.

The Government will introduce resolution this coming term to enable the Speaker to prevent obstruction by the Parnellites.
