Montreal, July 23.—Between twelve and fifteen hundred disorderlies among them a great number of boys shouting "We won't have conscri tion," succeeded by organized ing, hissing and stone and eg throwing, succeeded in breaking up recruiting meeting at Lafontaine Parl to-night, when more than five thou and persons were gathered to hea Major Emile Ranger, recently r turned from the front, appeal for recruits for the Sixtieth Battalion, of the newer units being organize under French-Canadian auspices. Major Ranger was not allowed to speak and when he tried to secure a fer minutes' hearing, he and several o ficers from local battalions, with an escort from the 65th Regiment at the band of the 60th Battalion, b came a target for the stones and egg Finally all left the platform and park, a path being forced through the side of the audience.
